

American Board of Forensic Odontology Dental Identification Workshop

The American Board of Forensic Odontology will present its first Dental Identification Workshop in conjunction with the 2010 AAFS Meeting in Seattle, WA.

Workshop Objectives:

1. To present the importance of, history and basic through advanced techniques of forensic dental human identification.
2. To provide hands-on experience of forensic dental examination techniques.
3. To provide for up to five of the required identification credits for ABFO board eligibility.

The presentations will focus on forensic dental examination, comparison and identification techniques. They will cover pertinent topics such as access to the oral structures, dental features useful in comparative dental identification (restorative and anatomic), missing and unidentified person reports and databases (NCIC, NamUs, VICTIMS), Odontosearch, SEM, XRF, CBCT, AM/PM radiograph superimposition, cremated remains examination, dental biological profiling, the role of the forensic dentist in mass fatality incident identification and more. Presenters will include Robert Wood DDS, PhD, Peter Bush BS, Peter Loomis DDS, Warren Tewes DDS and Gary Berman DDS.

During the Saturday session participants will perform clinical and radiographic examinations on dried specimens, prepare written reports, examine a series of “historic paper” cases and will be evaluated by members of both the ABFO Missing and Unidentified Persons and Certification and Examination Committees. Those whose dental identifications, radiographs, reports and successful completion of historic ID cases meet certain standards, will be given credit for up to five of the ID requirements for ABFO board eligibility. The Workshop will accept twelve “full participants” for both days as well as an unlimited number of “attendees” that will participate in the Friday evening lecture sessions. Full participants will be sent antemortem records ahead of time to facilitate advance preparation, and will be accepted on a first come, first serve basis.

Note: the twelve full participant slots are filled, but there are still openings available for the Friday night lecture presentations.

4.5 hours of dental continuing education credit will be given to those attending the Friday night lecture session alone and up to 30 hours for those participating in the entire workshop, through the AGD/PACE program,
